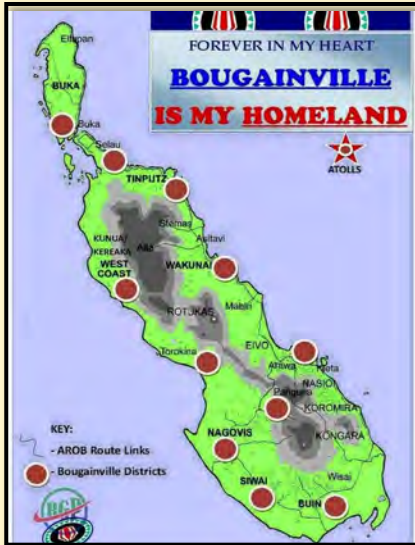

### TOGETHER TOWARDS AN UNIFIED BOUGAINVILLE



We are with one heart and mind with our confreres in Bougainville as they help to prepare the 300,000 Bougainvilleans for a referendum to be now held on 23rd November 2019. This is the culmination of a peace process that began in 1997 ending the almost 10 years of civil war which claimed as many as 20,000 lives.

Bougainville, since 2005, has had an autonomous government. This referendum is to see whether they can extend this to full independence. The Reconciliations and weapons disposal were required before the referendum. Pictured was the reconciliation ceremony, recently, at Ibirai village, Buin, South Bougainville. Our prayers for a peaceful referendum and an outcome that would truly unite the people of Bougainville.



### MORESBY YOUTH: MARY MODEL OF HOLINESS
