TUTU AND THE "TREE OF BREAD"





The Tutu Rural Training Centre under the leadership of its director, Fr Petero Matairatu sm, has recently held a breadfruit symposium focusing on breadfruit as an alternative cropping for sustainable farming practices. Breadfruit is a common traditional staple food in the Islands of the South Pacific, and is known as uto (Fiji), ulu (Samoa), mei (Tonga), kapiak (PNG), bulo and (Solomon), beta (Vanuatu). The breadfruit has the potential to play a significant role not only in alleviating hunger but also as

a commodity for both the local economy and export markets. With a growing health-conscious society the offering of gluten-free breadfruit products are in great demand.

'API-FO'OU COLLEGE, TONGA CELEBRATING ITS 156 ANNI-



The inclement weather did not dampen the spirit of the principal, Fr 'Ekuasi Manu sm and the 'Api-fo'ou college past pupils as they marched from the Cathedral, after celebrating the Eucharist marking the birth of 'Api-fo'ou college 156 years ago by its founder, the "Father of Catholic Education in Tonga", Fr Amand Lamaze sm who was later consecrated

as the Bishop of Central Oceania in 1879. 'Api-fo'ou college began by Fr Lamaze with the name "St Stanislaus". In 1886 it was moved to the present site called "new home" or "api-fo'ou". The first principal in residence in the new home was Fr Emilien Thomas sm and he was in charge of the college for 20 years.

When Peter Chanel was beatified in 1889 'Api-fo'ou was dedicated to the name and the patronage of Blessed (and later in 1954, Saint) Peter Chanel. In 1964 'Api-fo'ou was renamed St John's until 1986 when it was combined with St Mary's, begun by the SMSMs, and named 'Api-fo'ou again. Adveniat Regnum Tuum!

St Raphael Elementary School—Cycle for Children fund




The students of St Raphael's Elementary school in the parish of St Aloysius, Tabago, Bougainville together with

71st Anniversary of the establishment of St John's the Evangelist, Dala, Solomon Islands

The parishioners reenacted the arrival of the first Marist priest, Fr Authur Devlen sm on the 16th of May 1950 by welcoming the current parish priest, Fr Peter Puamae sm to the shore of Dala by the grandchild of the one who received the first parish priest 71 years ago. The parishioners also built a 6-meter cross to mark the occasion. The Marists took care of the new parish from 1950 until 1998. It was handed over to the diocese of Auki until



2010 when the Marists were asked to take it back again. Included in the parish is the St John's community school. The school will reach the form 6 or the Year 12 level in 2022. Assisting the parish priest is

Fr Soane 'Ahohako sm who is having a break from studies in the Philippines due to Covid-19.
