EDUCATION - SETS HEARTS FREE

Thailand : Ranong

Our Marist Asia Foundation (MAF) is for refugees from Burma who come to Ranong to escape poverty, exploitation and war.

In Ranong there is high rate of HIV AIDS due to poverty, trafficking, desperation and lack of education.

MAF responds to the needs of those who are sick with HIV AIDS and those who are caring for them.

Our HIV AIDS Health Project supports 100 patients and 400 family members and provides assistance by: Patient Home visits, Community Based Health Programs and importantly Emotional and Social Support.

MAF provides secondary education for 100 students as well as On-Line courses with the Australian Catholic University. Results indicate that education is highly valued by refugees: there is a 97% attendance and 90% of students score above average marks for our secondary students.

Education is a key to a future with hope.

Some students are now training to be teachers and recently Graduated with a Certificate in Teaching and Learning.

These young students are fluent in three languages — Burmese, Thai and English.

Our Balay Pasilungan program is for Street Boys who have been abandoned by their families due to poverty, family violence, alcohol problems or mental health issues.

The program offers a safe place for the boys to live, as well as education and skills for healthy living.
