Asian American Pacific Islander Heritage Month

In May, the United States celebrates Asian American Pacific Islander Heritage Month (also proclaimed as Asian American and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander Heritage Month). The Society of Mary has worked with the people of these regions both in their homelands and in the United States. Marist Saint Peter Chanel is the patron saint of Oceania and the Marists were the first missionaries to travel to that area.

We'd first like to highlight our work in Hawaii. The Marists went to Hawaii at the invitation of Bishop Sweeney in 1944. During World War II, additional missionaries could not be sent to many areas of the South Pacific, but at the same time, the increasing number of Catholics among American servicemen and native Hawaiians on the Hawaiian Islands could not be adequately served by the Sacred Heart priests who had previously been there.

Four Marist priests - Reverends Joseph Callaghan, William Collins, Joseph Robeck, and James Gilbride, SM - traveled aboard a refrigeration ship, along with forty laypeople and 5000 cases of liquor, from San Francisco to take over two parishes on Kauai. Over the sixty years the Marists served in Hawaii, these two parishes grew to six churches. The Marists departed in 2004.
